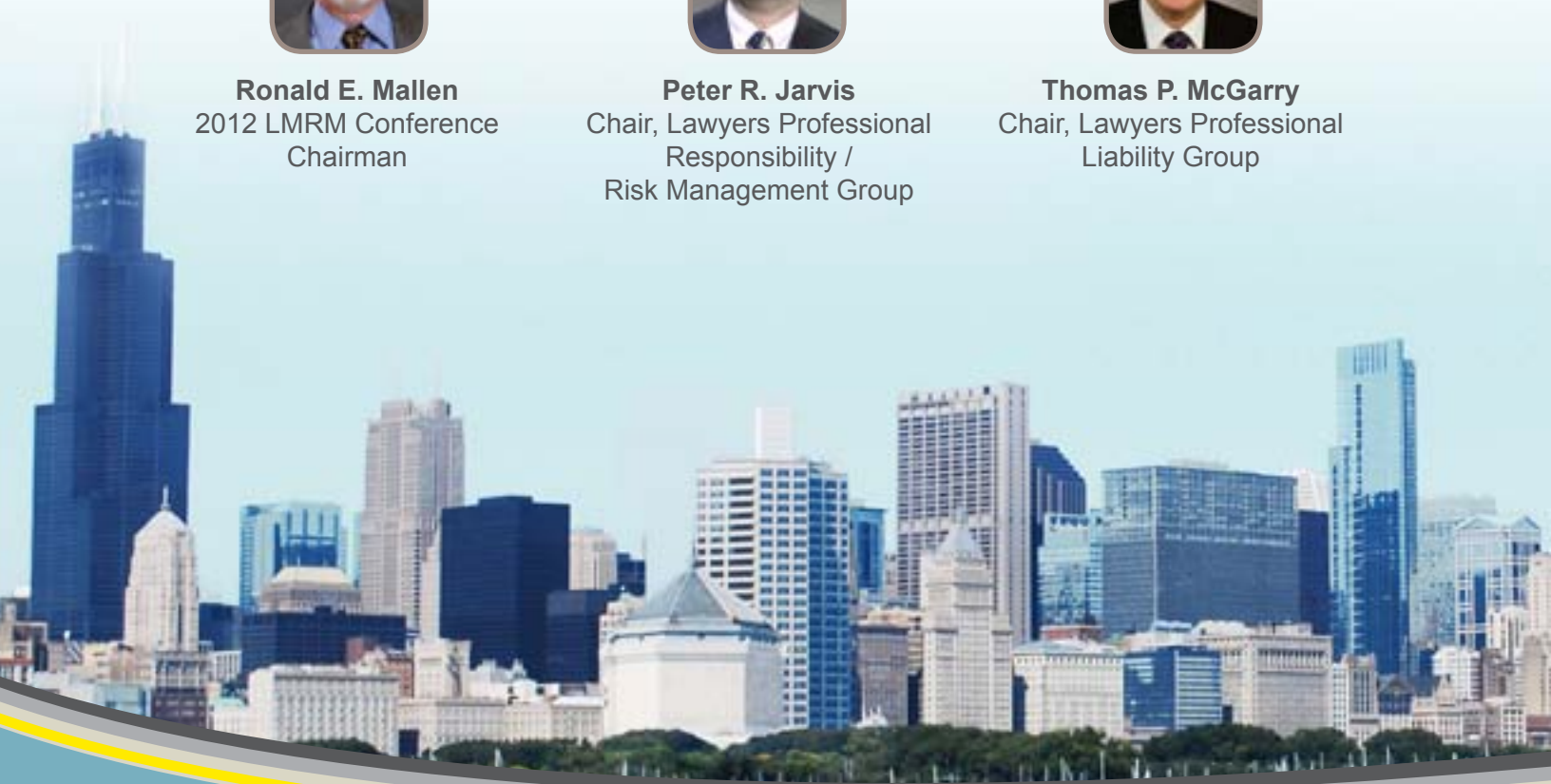

The defenses of *in pari delicto*, the adverse interest exception and the *Wagoner* doctrine are often available in “big ticket” financial fraud cases, such as actions against professionals by bankruptcy trustees. ## The Plaintiff’s Lost or Impaired Remedy: Issues of Proof Regarding Collectibility

Valuing a plaintiff’s claimed loss often turns on the issue of collectibility. Over the last year, the existing case law on the subject has been augmented by important decisions that provide guidance on how to analyze collectibility issues, what evidence can be considered and in what manner, who has the burden of proof, and what pretrial remedies are available. The panelists will review those recent decisions and discuss the developing principles in this significant area of legal malpractice litigation, including the impact that insurance and other collateral sources (or lack thereof) may have on assessing “collectibility.”

## The Significant New Decisions Affecting Litigation Attorneys

## Insurance Law: Significant Decisions of the Past Year

This past year’s insurance coverage cases address a number of new issues and some familiar ones. Similar concerns underlie the need for law firms to implement measures to minimize the risk of ethical breaches, and the consequent risk of disciplinary action.
